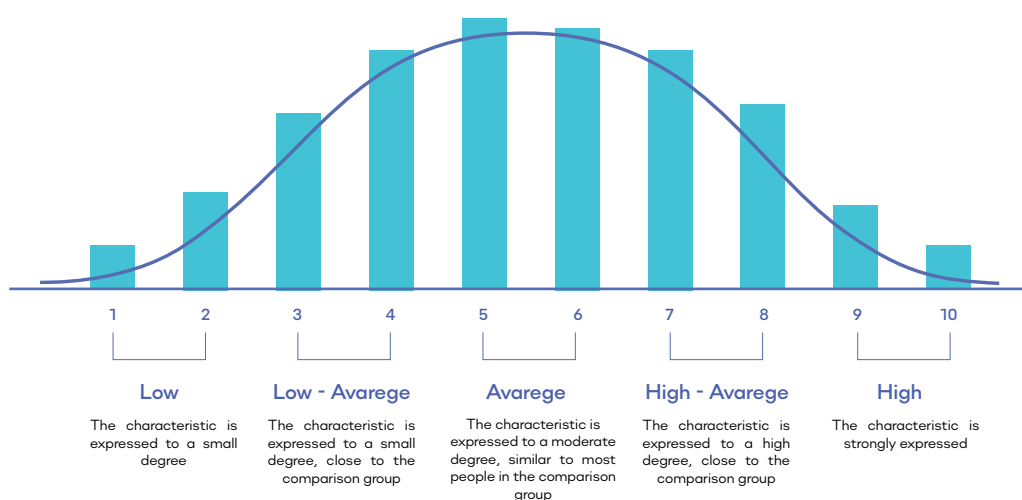
### What the Personality results contain

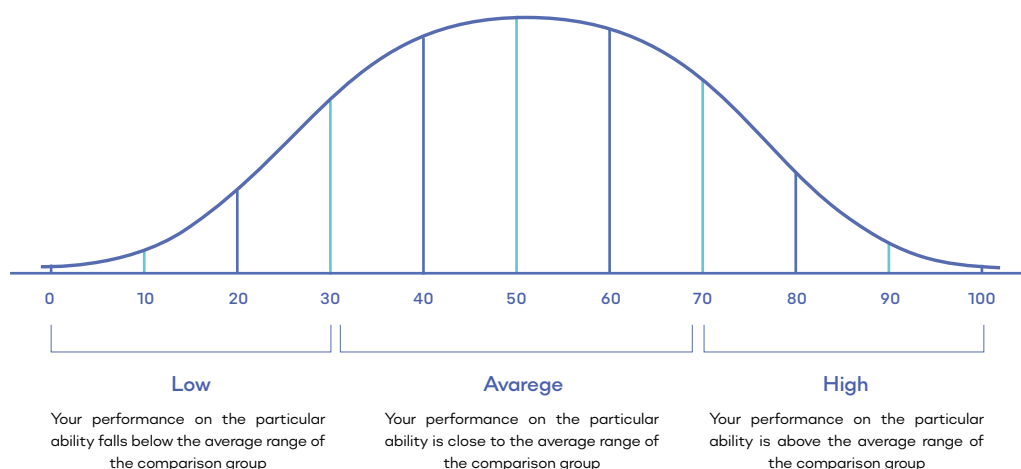

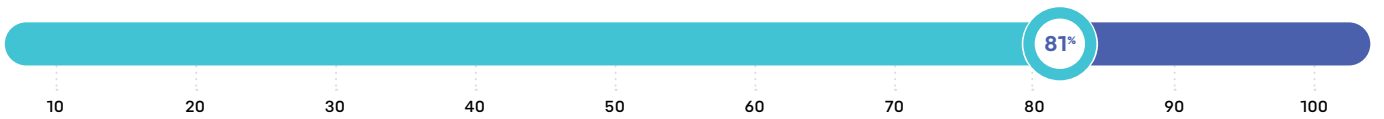

### Verbal Reasoning Ability

Verbal reasoning relates to the ability to understand, process and combine verbal information, in order to reach logical conclusions. The particular ability is important for activities related to understanding instructions at the workplace, reading and drafting texts / documents / reports, and generally interpreting written and spoken language.

You have completed a Verbal Reasoning test to examine the particular ability. Specifically, you were provided with some texts, each of which was followed by several relevant questions with five alternative answers for each question. You were asked to select the answer you considered to be correct out of the five options provided, relying solely on the information presented in the text.
